




# NATIONAL OPIOID SETTLEMENTS

- The **national opioid settlements** resulted from lawsuit negotiations, requiring opioid manufacturers and distributors to pay back more than **\$50 billion** over a period of **18 years** to the American people **through state and local governments**
- Harnett County will receive upwards of \$11,000,000 distributed over 18 years, from Fiscal Year 2022-23 through Fiscal Year 2038-39, through a Memorandum of Agreement with North Carolina
- \$215,000 has been allocated to the Medication-Assisted Treatment/Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MAT/MOUD) program in the Harnett County Detention Center
- \$20,000 has been allocated to the purchase of Narcan for community distribution, including the School System

- Apr 2022: North Carolina Attorney General finalized the Memorandum between North Carolina and Harnett County
- **Summer 2022:** began engaging stakeholders and forming Opioid Task Force
- September 12, 2022: first Opioid Task Force meeting
- October 20, 2022: Opioid Task Force meeting
- **December 2022:** Reaching Rural Initiative kick-off & monthly meetings with coaches began
- February 9, 2023: Opioid Task Force meeting informational presentation by Dr. David Tillman & his students (Campbell University)



# FORMATION OF CORE LEADERSHIP TEAM

- The Reaching Rural Initiative was vital for building a leadership team to develop our strategic plan and task force
- Harnett County was the only team in the 2023 cohort that included a K-12 school system representative



- The involvement of Dr. Jermaine White, Asst. Superintendent, as well as counselors and nursing staff from Harnett County Schools, laid the foundation for a transformative partnership
- The Opioid Task Force is proud that Harnett County Schools is becoming a within the State of North Carolina

- **March 27, 2023:** informational presentation by Dr. Robert Agnello (Campbell University)
- April 20, 2023: Opioid Task Force meeting & prioritization exercise to gather input from Task Force members
- Apr-May 2023: Community Paramedic program expands to include post-overdose response
- **May 2023:** Reaching Rural visit to Franklin County, MA
- May 15, 2023: presentation of priorities identified by Opioid Task Force to Board of Commissioners & public input session

#### The Executive Committee reviews funding proposals from subcommittees

### • If Executive Committee votes to approve a funding proposal, it must then go before the Opioid Task Force for a vote

• If the Opioid Task Force approves, the Executive Committee shall propose the project to the Harnett County **Commissioners** for formal approval

- February 2024: monthly subcommittee meetings began
- March 7, 2024: Recovering Hope Conference
- April 11, 2024: Executive Committee reviewed and unanimously approved naloxone funding proposal
- April 18, 2024: Opioid Task Force reviewed and unanimously approved naloxone funding proposal
- May 1, 2024: jail launched Phase II of MAT/MOUD
- May 6, 2024: County Commissioners adopted resolution to allocate settlement funds to community-based naloxone distribution
- May 6, 2024: County Commissioners voted to accept \$98,000 in Reaching Rural grant funding to go towards the Jail Re-entry Navigator's salary



# MAIN ACCOMPLISHMENTS TO DATE

#### **Prevent harmful substance use**

- Harnett County Schools hired Clinical Social Worker to serve students
- Campbell University and local faith leaders led Recovering Hope Conference
- Continued collaboration with community- and faith-based organizations

#### **Support treatment and recovery**

- Sheriff's Office initiated Phase I of MAT/MOUD in jail (continuation of MAT/MOUD for existing patients)
- Sheriff's Office hired Jail Re-entry Navigator to provide critical support
- Sheriff's Office initiated Phase II of MAT/MOUD in jail (inducting new patients onto MAT/MOUD treatment)
- Community Paramedicine program continues to expand to support individuals navigating substance use disorder

- Harnett County Health Department distributes free Narcan to individuals and community-based organizations
- County Board of Commissioners has allocated \$20,000 to Narcan for community distribution
- Harnett County Schools has equipped each campus with Narcan
- Harnett County Schools has trained over 100 staff members to administer Narcan and continues to train more
- Harnett County Schools is preparing to launch pilot program for Narcan kits on school buses
- County staff has arranged to receive an allocation of free Narcan from Alliance Health

# WHAT'S NEXT

- Collaborating with Health Department to create policies & procedures for community-based naloxone distribution
- Coordinating Peer Support services with the help of Alliance Health
- By the beginning of the 2024–25 school year, Harnett County Schools intend to...
  - Train all HCS staff members to administer Narcan
  - $\circ\,$  Launch pilot program for Narcan kits on all school buses
- Collaborating with community members to support a parent advocacy group
- Expanding Post-Overdose Response Team
